## *From the Pastor...*

The season of Lent began officially on Ash Wednesday, February 25, with a call to fasting and repentance ("Return to the Lord, your God, who is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love." Joel 2:13). During Lent, Christians reflect on the meaning of our baptism into Christ's death and resurrection. The cross of ashes on our foreheads reminds us of our mortality and frailty as human beings. We seek the renewal of the Spirit as we move ever-closer to the Easter event. This experience is both an individual journey and a corporate one.

As individuals, we may have a Lenten ritual which aids us in reflecting upon our own mortality and our dependence upon God – such as setting aside certain times for devotions and prayer, a time for fasting and meditating, or refraining from enjoying certain things that we typically enjoy as a means of simplifying our lives and gaining a greater understanding of who we are emotionally and spiritually. This kind of Lenten discipline, and the forms it takes, depend upon the individual.

Lent is also a time for congregations to come together in ways that we may not at any other time of the year: mid-week meals that provide a chance for members and guests to gain a greater insight into one another, mid-week worship that provides us an opportunity to reflect upon who we are and what we are about as a congregation. I especially appreciate our mid-week Lenten services as a means for corporate worship and reflection through the Holden Evening Service and the dramatic interpretations of Lenten themes by the Acts of Grace. You can't help but go away from these services feeling blessed and encouraged to face the unknown for the rest of the week.

Some of you resourceful individuals may have already figured out that if you count the number of days from Ash Wednesday until Easter that you get 47 days, not 40. Now, go back and subtract the Sundays, and you will find that your total is 40. Sundays in the Christian faith are excluded from the counting of the 40 days of Lent, because they are still observed as commemorations of the Easter event, even during such a solemn season. The forty days of Lent call us to prayer, fasting, and resisting temptation, just as Jesus did at the beginning of his ministry.

However you choose to observe the season of Lent individually, I hope that you will join your church family on Wednesdays and Sundays as, together, we walk the road toward the triumphal entry into Jerusalem, the Crucifixion, and the Resurrection of our Lord.

Family of Grace,

Over the next 4 weeks we will be forming a Circle of Support to help a family that will be graduating from the PLM-Families Together program. The Circle of Support will exist for 12 to 18 months and will meet monthly to discuss and then act on ways to help our Family. We need 6 to 10 people that want to be involved for the whole time, and people who want to share their gifts on a limited basis. This first year of transitioning back into permanent housing after having been homeless brings many challenges to a family. As a Circle of Support we will help a family meet some of these challenges.

*LFS Carolina***Opportunity for a Better Life**

Each year, more than 20,000 young people age out of the foster care system. This group is at a high risk of dropping out of school, unplanned pregnancies, poor health, criminal activity and homelessness.

With LFS Carolinas providing supervision and support to foster families who care for more than 500 children across the Carolinas each year, these numbers hit very close to home. It was in direct response to this issue that LFS Carolinas began Opportunity 4 Supervised Apartments (O4SA).

The O4SA program is designed to help young adults who are aging out of the system become self-sufficient. The program provides apartment living as well as the connections they need for education, employment, healthcare and supportive personal and community relationships.

Young adults who enter the program immediately begin working toward their independence. With assistance from Hampton Crossing Apartments in Durham, NC, each young adult signs their own lease and begins paying rent which starts at \$25 and goes up \$25 a month, capping at the total rent amount. Having their name on a lease allows them to build their credit while learning money management and budgeting.

In collaboration with Durham County Department of Social Services, the program gives young adults a comfort zone as well as independence enabling them to utilize the skills they have learned. At the same time, the program assists young adults in providing additional tools and services personalized to fit their individual needs and circumstances.

In this apartment setting, they will be assisted in continuing or discovering healthy interests, developing life skills, improving interpersonal communication and problem solving. The program will assist in cultivating support systems and ultimately will enable them to become productive members of their community.

## *North Raleigh Ministries*

The Consumer Product Safety Improvement Act of 2008 was signed into law August 2008 and went into effect on February 10, 2009. This legislation caused us to remove all products manufactured specifically for children 12 years old or younger. At this time, we are not able to sell these items. The safety of children and adults is a priority that North Raleigh Ministries takes very seriously. We will continue to focus on this issue and adjust our inventory as allowed by federal law. This struggling young lady told the interviewer that her family has some food in the house—she had instructed her children to eat what they wanted, but to save her enough for one meal a day. Because of you, these children—and their mom—can eat more than one meal a day.

## *Other witnesses about Christ*

There is much historical evidence, besides the Bible, that Jesus did indeed live and that his life, death and resurrection were the foundation of Christianity.

One famous non-Christian historical named Flavius Josephus lived about A.D. 37. He focused primarily on Jewish history but also wrote the following words: “Now there was about this time, Jesus, a wise man ... a doer of wonderful works. He drew over to him both many of the Jews and many of the Gentiles.”

The writings of Josephus provide important extra-biblical information about the people, customs and geography during Jesus’ time. Origen, a Christian author who wrote about the year 240, said Josephus “did not accept Jesus as Christ.” But by mentioning Jesus in his history texts, Josephus added credibility to the Lord’s earthly life.
